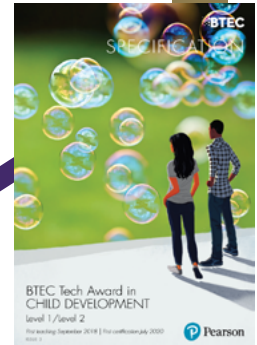

When and how assessment of learning will happen (throughout the course):

Students are assessed both via internal assessments and external assessments (exams). The Internal assessments are called PSAs (Pearson set assignments), these are coursework/assignment style tasks completed in lesson time. In Year 10, students will complete Component 1 PSA in the January-May assessment window. In January, Pearson will release 5 tasks based around a case study that students will need to complete in exam conditions during lesson times; they will be guided on how long to spend on each task. These assessments will then be marked by their class teacher and feedback will be provided. This work is then externally moderated and students will receive their mark out of 60 in August.

Home Learning Expectations

All work completed in lessons will be available for students to access on their google classroom, this means that they are able to keep up to date with all the required information/notes for PSA tasks. Students will need to ensure that they are fully prepared for each of their PSA tasks. Watch videos of children aged three to five years – 'The Secret Life of 4 years olds' (Channel 4) - look at the different areas of development and how activities can support their development.
