

KS5 (AQA A-Level Drama & Theatre)

Curriculum Purpose

Students follow the AQA Drama A Level syllabus which is divided up into three assessment components. Students will need to create a devised piece from stimuli that they choose. They need to create the piece in the style of a specific Drama Practitioner, again chosen by them. This will be accompanied with an extended piece of coursework, and is marked internally. They will then create a scripted performance which has to be in the style of a different Drama Practitioner which will be marked by an external examiner who comes to the school. This too is accompanied by an extended piece of coursework called the Reflective Report And lastly there is a written exam where students will be answering questions on two scripts and a piece of Live Theatre studied over the two years.

- Devised Piece and Working
 Notebook submitted and marked
- Scripted Extract and Reflective Report Preparation and Exam
- C1 Revision Yerma by Lorca, Antigone by Sophocles and Live Theatre

As well as the practical exams themselves there will be continuous feedback in the lessons as well as dress and technical rehearsals

There are three mock exams throughout the year which solely focus on the written exam component.

The final exams/ assessment:

- Devised Piece and Working Notebook
- Scripted Piece and Reflective Report
- Written Exam
