KS4 (Edexcel GCSE Geography B)

Curriculum Overview

Year 10 and 11 Geographers at Christ the King College study the Edexcel B GCSE Geography specification. The course builds upon KS3 learning to develop students' knowledge and understanding of place, processes and interactions at a variety of scales, from local fieldwork investigations, to UK and global issues. Students are encouraged to make geographical decisions by applying their knowledge, understanding and integrated geographical skills to real-life 21st century people and environmental issues.



Curriculum Topics

Paper I Global Geographical Issues (37.5% of GCSE, 94 marks, 90 minutes)

- Topic I: Hazardous Earth
- Topic 2: Development Dynamics
- Topic 3: Challenges of an Urbanising World

Paper 2 UK Geographical Issues

(37.5% of GCSE, 94 marks, 90 minutes)

- Topic 4:The UK's Evolving Physical Landscape
- Topic 6: Fieldwork (Coastal)

Each topic is assessed via a mixture of I-4 mark questions which include multiple choice questions, own knowledge 'explanation' questions and questions assessing a variety of geographical skills including maths and figure interpretation. Each topic also has one 8-mark 'assess' or 'evaluate' question.


Home Learning Expectations



 Decisions (25% of GCSE, 64 marks, 90 minutes)
