Isle of Wight Schools Literary Festival 2024 - visiting authors

Christ the King College was delighted to welcome two visiting authors into college today as

part of the Isle of Wight Schools Literary Festival 2024. Author and editor, Lil Chase, delighted Year 8 students with extracts from her very funny book, Boys for Beginners, and shared her personal journey into the world of writing. She explained that the best way to come up with a story is to first develop a set of characters from which to base your narrative. She then worked with the students to put this into practice, with some very engaging ideas coming from the audience! She finished the session with a Question and Answer session, where Year 8 impressed with some really insightful and thought-provoking questions.





Year 9 were then treated to a talk by author, M. A. Bennett, whose S.T.A.G.S series has been picked up and is currently in the early stages of development by 20th Century Fox! She shared her inspiration for the original book, including her own experiences of feeling like an 'outsider' in several situations. Like Lil, Marina started writing at the tender age of just ten years old which I'm sure has inspired some of our students to start writing themselves. Questions answered included how to get your work published and what she thinks about the more contemporary ways of accessing reading such as audiobooks and eReaders. She also discussed her Young Gothic novel (which ties in nicely with what Year

9 students are studying in English at the moment!)

Year 12 A level business students attended the Young Enterprise launch conference at Island Riding centre today where they met with their business advisor Guy Wells from AJ Wells and Sons. The programme is internationally recognised and gives students a chance to experience the highs and lows of running a business themselves with the support and guidance of a local business mentor.
